



National Museums Scotland has one of the most comprehensive collections of ancient glass in Britain. The objects include vessels and utensils that range in date from the Late Bronze Age to the Middle Ages, thus spanning over two millennia of glassmaking. All four of the major techniques – core-forming, casting, blowing and mould-blowing – are represented, and the different ways in which the glass was decorated and used are described.



This book is the first comprehensive catalogue of a major public collection of ancient glass in Britain. It has been compiled by Chris Lightfoot, Associate Curator in the Department of Greek and Roman Art at the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York, drawing on his extensive knowledge of the collections there and in the British Museum, in addition to his archaeological expertise gained during many years of fieldwork in Turkey.
